Irenaeus emphasizes that salvation occurs through Christ's Incarnation, which bestows incorruptibility on humanity, rather than emphasizing His Redemptive death in the crucifixion, although the latter event is an integral part of the former.

Irenaeus thus thinks that our salvation comes about, essentially, through the incarnation of God as man. He characterises the penalty for sin as death and corruption. God, however, is immortal and incorruptible, and simply by becoming united to human nature in Christ he conveys those qualities to us: they spread, as it were, like a benign infection.

According to Irenaeus, this verse was used by the Gnostics to argue that "the handiwork of God is not saved." Irenaeus also polemiced against Marcion of Sinope, who preached that the creator God of the Hebrew Bible and the Father of Jesus Christ were two different gods. Irenaeus argues that the same god who sent Jesus to the Earth also led man through history by way of the Jewish law and prophets.

According to Irenaeus God alone—the Father by means of his Son and Holy Spirit—created human beings. The ascription of creative activity to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit alongside the proscription of creative activity from Powers, angels, and others reveals the firm divide Irenaeus sees between the Three and all else.
